Santa Arrives at Teterboro Airport





Moonachie School District 100 Years of Pride

(Editor's Note: In celebration of the Robert L. Craig School's 100th Anniversary, over the course of the next few issues, The Gazette Newspaper is providing a multi-part reflection. The following is a reflection by Barbara Zarriello, who served the district from 1966 to 2005.

Thanks for the Memories!

I began my teaching career in 1966 in Moonachie at the James McKinney School. The school is no longer there, but the memories of my first two years there will always remain with me.

The McKinney School was a four-room building. It housed the Third and Fourth Grades. I taught the Third Grade with

Annette Sprechman and the Fourth Grade teachers were Vera Gerber and Helen Herman.

We taught in self-contained classrooms, which meant that we had no specials. We had to incorporate art and music into our schedules along with doing lunch and playground duty. It was a wonderful learning experience and the children and the parents of the community were always helpful and respectful. I will never forget my first two years at the James McKinney School. I enjoyed it so much that I continued working in Moonachie for 39 years. I taught Grades 1, 3, and 4 at R.L. Craig School until my retirement in June 2005.



The Basics of a **Home Equity Loan**

loan? A home equity loan is a loan that uses your home as collateral. Your home equity is the part of your home that you actually own and this is the guarantee for your loan.

A home equity loan, often called a second mortgage, reduces your equity or ownership in your home. Since your home guarantees your loan, if you default on the payments, you can lose your home.

Advantages and disadvantages of a home equity loan. A lower interest rate and tax deductions are the two major advantages home equity loans have over other types of debt.

Since a home equity loan is secured by your home, it poses less risk to a lender than does a non-secured personal loan or credit cards - this lower risk is passed on to you in the form of a lower interest rate.

The second major advantage is that regardless of the way a home equity loan is used, the interest you pay on the first \$100,000 you borrow is tax deductible. Credit cards and other types of non-secured loans do not have this tax benefit. This means that if you pay \$3,000 in interest on your home equity

The biggest drawback of a home equity loan is the fact that your home is on the line and you could lose your home if you default on your payments. In addition to interest you will pay on the loan, there are also costs associated with taking out a home equity loan - these costs are similar to the costs you paid when you bought your home

Be aware of the unfavorable loan terms. Terms to be aware of are: a pre-payment penalty, credit insurance, and interest rate increase on late payments.

Pre-payment Penalty. Pre-payment penalty is a onetime penalty fee paid to the lender if you pay off a home equity loan early. A pre-payment penalty provision in a home equity loan is very expensive and a penalty of 10% of the loan amount is not uncommon. This means that on a loan of \$50,000, you could pay \$5,000 if you pay off the loan early.

Credit Insurance. Credit insurance on a home equity loan is always optional - ask if your loan includes credit insurance. Credit insurance can include items such as credit life insurance, disability insurance and unemployment insurance. If you do think you need credit insurance, your lender is probably not the best place to get it. Check with insurance providers and also consider alternatives such as traditional life insurance - a life insurance policy is usually a cheaper alternative to credit life insurance.

Interest Rate Increase in Cases of Default. A loan may have a provision for an increase in interest rates if you miss a payment or pay late. The increased interest rate will apply to the rest of the loan term. This can be a very expensive consequence if for any reason you miss a loan payment. ###







A Christmas Story

Godwin Gabriel Pena received the "Gift of Life" this Christmas.

Godwin arrived in the United States from the Philippines in August 2011 with his mother Lenila Pena. At 11 years old, he was a walking "time bomb."

He weighed 39 pounds, his nails were blue and he couldn't walk. He suffered from Tetralogy of Fallot (TOF), a congenital heart defect which is classically understood to involve anatomical abnormalities. It is the most common cyanotic heart defect, and the most common cause of blue baby syndrome.

He was so weak, he had to gain 10 pounds before surgery,

which took place on November 1 at Montefiore Hospital in Bronx, NY.

He spent 25 days in the hospital, had many complications, was paralyzed for 14 days and was in ICU for 19 days.

He was released from the hospital November 25, and will be going home on January 4, 2012.

Godwin, full of energy and vitality, had the opportunity to meet his "Santas" during the Mid-Bergen Rotary Club Christmas luncheon on December 20, at the **Holiday Inn** in Hasbrouck Heights.

The Mid-Bergen Rotary sponsored this child through the "Gift of Life" program. They raised the \$6,000 to cover



the incidental costs. This was achieved from the proceeds of their 2010 Annual Beefsteak and Auction.

arranges for transportation. A volunteer team of medical professionals perform the necessary life-saving surgery. Mid-Bergen Rotarian Ruth Nebiar

and her husband, Fred, were the host family for Godwin and his mother during their stay in the United States. (Yes, Virginia, there is a Santa Claus.) ###







Reflections

Hope into Action

The first of January is traditionally marked as a day of new beginnings.

With much hope, many engage in a process of formulating resolutions commiserate with goals for self improvement and advancement.

For some, the prospect of entering a new year is daunting as there is so much uncertainty.

In essence, there are many ways to approach the dawn of a new year. In light of the perspectives, what I submit to you is quite simple: we do not know what the new year has in store for us; but, why not hope and strive for the best?

In the course of a discussion on the existence of God, a friend of mine once remarked "hope is for the resigned."

Although hearing this statement made me pause for a moment, I began to engage in deep reflection about the gravity of those sentiments.

The next day, I wrote an email to this friend and replied: "hope without action is for the resigned!" Our propensity and existential longing to live and confront the challenges of life is based on the hope for the better. However, my friend was correct in saying that merely relying on the laurels of hope will get us nowhere!

In order for our hope to be more than an endless quest, we need to engage in active practices that will orient ourselves to what we hope for. While we should hope for improvement in our lives, our community, and our nation, unless we truly reflect on the way we orient ourselves to be open for change, hope will be a mere theoretical longing rather than an avenue through which we can contribute to transformation.

While we certainly do not know what the future holds, hoping and striving for a markedly better tomorrow is better than drowning in a morass of endless self pity.

The equation of hopeorientation + reflective-action is one among a plethora of tools to encourage us to meet the goal of a better tomorrow. ###

Filling You In

What is a Root Canal?

Underneath your tooth's outer enamel and within the dentin is an area of soft tissue called the pulp tissue. While a tooth's pulp tissue does contain nerve fibers, it is also composed of arteries, veins, lymph vessels, and connective tissue.

Each tooth's nerve enters the tooth at the very tip of its roots. From there, the nerve runs through the center of the root in small "root canals," which join up with the tooth's pulp chamber.

Root canals are very small, thin divisions that branch off from the top pulp chamber down to the tip of the root. A tooth has at least one but no more than four root canals.

Why do I feel pain?

When the pulp becomes infected due to a deep cavity or fracture that allows bacteria to seep in, or injury due to trauma, it can die. Damaged or dead pulp causes increased blood flow and cellular activity, and pressure cannot be relieved from inside the tooth. Pain in the tooth is commonly felt when biting down, chewing on it and applying hot or cold foods and drinks.

Why do I need root canal therapy?

Root canal therapy is necessary because the tooth will not heal by itself. Without treatment, the infection will spread, bone around the tooth will begin to degenerate and the tooth may fall out.

Pain usually worsens until one is forced to seek emergency dental attention. The only alternative is usually extraction of the tooth, which can cause surrounding teeth to shift crookedly, resulting in a bad bite. Though an extraction is cheaper, the space left behind will require an implant or a bridge, which can be more expensive than root canal therapy. If you have the choice, it's always best to keep your original teeth.

What is a root canal procedure?

A root canal is a procedure done to save the damaged or dead pulp in the root canal of the tooth by cleaning out the diseased pulp and reshaping the canal. The canal is filled with a rubberlike substance called gutta-percha or another material to prevent recontamination of the tooth. The tooth is then permanently sealed, with possibly a post and/or a crown made of porcelain or metal

alloy. This enables patients to keep the original tooth.

What is involved in root canal therapy?

Once your general dentist performs tests on the tooth and recommends therapy, he or she can perform the treatment or refer you to an endodontist (a pulp specialist). Treatment usually involves one to three appointments.

First, you will probably be given a local anesthetic to numb the area. A rubber sheet is then placed around the tooth to isolate it. Next, an opening is drilled from the crown into the pulp chamber, which, along with the root canal, is cleaned of all diseased pulp and reshaped.

Medication may be inserted into the area to fight bacteria. Depending on the condition of the tooth, the crown may then be sealed temporarily to guard against recontamination, the tooth may be left open to drain or the dentist may go right ahead and fill the canals.

If you're given a temporary filling, usually on the next visit it's removed and the pulp chamber and canal(s) are filled with gutta-percha or another material to prevent recontamination. If the tooth is still weak, a metal post may be inserted above the canal filling to reinforce the tooth. Once filled, the area is permanently sealed. Finally, a gold or porcelain crown is normally placed over the tooth to strengthen its structure and improve appearance.

What are the risks and complications? More than 95 percent of

root canal treatments are successful. However, sometimes a procedure needs to be redone due to diseased canal offshoots that went unnoticed or the fracture of a filing instrument, both of which rarely occur. Occasionally, a root canal therapy will fail altogether, marked by a return of pain.

What happens after treatment?

Natural tissue inflammation may cause discomfort for a few days, which can be controlled by an over-the-counter analgesic. A follow-up exam can monitor tissue healing. From this point on, brush and floss regularly, avoid chewing hard foods with the treated tooth, and see your dentist regularly.

Are there options to root canal therapy?

The only alternative to root canal therapy is to extract the tooth; however, this alone can cause the surrounding teeth to move, resulting in a bad bite. Though a simple extraction may be perceived as less expensive, the empty space left behind will require an implant or a bridge, which ultimately can be more costly than root canal therapy.

Notice to Lodi Dog and Cat Owners

Your 2011 dog or cat license will expire on January 31, 2012. The sale of 2012 licenses will commence in January of 2012, NOT BEFORE.

No licenses will be issued prior to January 3, 2012. The municipality issuing the licenses does not have the authority to issue a license unless provided with a certification from a veterinarian showing that the animal has been inculated for rabies. The rabies vaccine may not expire before October 31, 2012. You may renew your license by returning the necessary license fees and a self-addressed, stamped envelope to Tax Assessor-Health Department, One Memorial Drive, Lodi, New Jersey 07644. Please make checks payable to Borough of Lodi.

You must include a copy of the rabies vaccination certificate and proof of spaying or neutering (please do not send originals, for they will not be returned).

The license and tag will be returned to you. You may also stop in at the Tax Assessor's office on the first floor of the Municipal Building, Room 103, between 9 a.m. and 2 p.m., Monday-Friday only. License fees: \$8 spayed/neutered dog or cat or \$11 un-spayed/neutered.

The annual rabies clinic will be held on Tuesday, January 10, 2012, at the Firehouse located at 99 Kennedy Drive, Lodi. The hours for the clinic will be from 4:30 p.m. to 7 p.m.

Notice to Wood-Ridge Dog and Cat Owners

Chapter 134 of the "Code of the Borough of Wood-Ridge" requires all dogs and cats to be licensed prior to January 31, 2012. Any person who violates the above provision and upon conviction thereof, is subject to a fine and/or a summons(es) issued, per pet.

Dog and cat licenses may be obtained at the Health Department, 85 Humboldt Street, Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. The license fee is \$18 for a neutered pet or \$21 per non-neutered pet.

As per New Jersey State law, rabies vaccination must be valid for the licensing year, valid until October 31, 2012. Before a license will be issued, proof is required.

Please be advised that if your veterinarian determines that your dog should not have a rabies shot, an exemption form must be completed and returned with your application and payment.

In addition, if your dog/cat has been spayed or neutered, proof of neutering is necessary.

'Tis the Season for Giving

Writing this article well before it gets published next month/year (but then, the holiday spirit lingers long after the events have passed...).

As most lenders are requiring home buyers to put down at least 20 percent – and sometimes, with more expensive properties, an even greater amount – the best holiday gift some people might receive would be help with the down payment.

Under federal tax law, each individual is permitted to give away money or valuables worth up to \$13,000 to a single recipient in a calendar year. A married couple could jointly bestow up to \$26,000 a year per recipient. And that could be \$52,000 if the recipient has a spouse or partner.

Moreover, if the gift-givers wanted to spread even more good cheer into the next calendar year – perhaps distributing some future inheritance money - they could easily double the amount to the same couple, to \$104,000!

(In other words, give them one for Christmas and, a week later, give them another for New Year's).

Let's face it: the biggest barrier to buying a home these days is saving for the down payment. The real estate website Trulia released a survey recently that was based on responses from over 2,200 people, including 758 renters who expressed an interest in buying a home this season. Fifty-one percent of those renters said coming up with the money for the down payment was keeping them from buying (and 62% among adults 18 to 34) while 36% identified qualifying for a mortgage as the stumbling block.

It can amount to a huge chunk for first-time buyers. And we're seeing even secondtime home buyers getting help from the family, especially if their new residence needs renovation.

A 20 percent down payment on a \$368,000 home - the median selling price in Hasbrouck Heights this year according to the New Jersey MLS – would require a buyer to come up with \$73,600, plus closing costs.

Relatives could, of course, give the entire \$76,000 down payment, though anything above the maximum annual exemption could be considered a taxable gift and must be reported to the Internal Revenue Service.

There is also, as I understand it, a way of lending a relative or close friend the money for the down payment, of the closing costs, then forgiving the loan in a future year. The recipient would simply have to pay interest on the loan until it was forgiven, at which time it would become a gift.

But, of course, before giving money to a son, daughter, niece or nephew, you should consider your own financial picture. Likewise, it's wise to make sure the recipient is not being chased by creditors and will use the money for the intended purpose. Once the check's been handed over, the money can be used for anything.




