Participation in this sale does not count towards the "two garage sales" per year ordinance.



Should you go "digital"?

Many of my studio customers are eager to purchase a digital camera, but they believe it's too complicated for them. This is really not the case.

Taking pictures with your digital camera is not much different than it is with your film camera.

The difference is the way the image is "captured." With film, the image is recorded on a piece of plastic which is coated with light sensitive chemicals.

With digital cameras, the image is captured on a light sensitive chip. Photography is light and lenses, and so all of the normal rules still apply.

Many people do not realize that the output printing options for digital images does include normal photographic prints (just like you get from your film camera).

These prints can be ordered online or from stores that provide picture processing. Yes, you can print them at home on your computer printer, but this is expensive and time consuming, especially if you are printing many images, such as from your vacation.

The difficulty with going digital for most people is not understanding how the process works. It's actually pretty simple.

When a digital camera takes a picture, a file is created in the memory card in the camera. Usually these files are "jpgs". Simply, a jpeg, or jpg image is just a file extension that indicates the picture has been "compressed" to conserve memory space and saved as a jpg. More expensive and/or professional level cameras

have other options, but these are not important to most amateur picture takers.

Most digital cameras sold today offer an easy method to transfer your pictures to your computer.

Usually a digital camera is sold with software that makes the process of transferring images to your computer and viewing them very simple.

According to Eastman Kodak, the top five reasons to go "digital" are....

1. See and improve pictures in a heartbeat -- You can review pictures instantly with a digital camera, so you'll be taking better pictures than ever before.

Somebody frowning? Somebody clowning? Just take another picture.

2. E-mail and print photos instantly -- Share digital pictures seconds after taking them. E-mail them anywhere; print them at home or online.

Or place them in an online album, so friends and family can view your pictures and order

3. Perfect your pictures with "digital magic" -- Was a picture too dark? Did someone have red eyes? That's okay. You can use picture-editing software to lighten pictures, get rid of red eye, crop pictures, and make lots of other improvements after you take the pic-

4. Unleash your creativity -- Fulfill those creative urges. Turn your digital pictures into photo greeting cards, high quality prints, CD album covers, photo T-shirts, online slide shows. You can do all this and more -- once your pictures are

digital.

The tour led to a review of


"Old Engine One."


