





## **RPD Earns Gold Award**

In 2020, the Rutherford Police Department Traffic Bureau continued with their pedestrian safety standard of excellence.

While Covid-19 brought about many changes to how the students of Rutherford attended school, the Rutherford Police Department took that time to assess our current practices.

Our continued safety enhancements resulted in Lisa Lee, Deputy Director, Bike & Pedestrian Programs, of EZ Ride to use the Traffic Police Track to nominate the Rutherford Police Department for the GOLD LEVEL of RECOGNITION FOR THE NEW JERSEY SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOLS PROGRAM.

Officer Bachmann, Traffic Coordinator, conducted our annual crossing guard training program. This training assists crossing guards with uniform and comprehensive training, allowing our crossing guards to perform their duties more



effectively and safely.

Officer Bachmann also monitored and made changes if needed at 5 busy intersections where the Rutherford Police Department has crossing guards assigned. Once completed, he submitted proof training records and 5 "Intersection Reports" to Sergeant Julie Ann Zeigler.

Sergeant Julie Ann Zeigler designed the annual Community Window display at 11 Park Avenue. The display promoted healthy walking and bicycling safely throughout the community. Families were encouraged to take an active

role in teaching their children the rules of the road by practicing age-appropriate distanced walks and bike rides.

Rutherford Mayor Frank Nunziato submitted a Letter of Support regarding the continued efforts of the Rutherford Police Department. This letter was included in the submitted application for the Safe Routes to Schools award.

With the completion of training and intersection reports, the Community Window display, Letter of Support from Mayor Nunziato, comprehensive Crossing Guard Policy, and Compete Streets Policy adopted, the Borough of Rutherford is one of EZ Ride's 6 Gold municipal awardees in 2021; term of award 2021-2023. There are only 9 Gold municipal awardees in all of New Jersey in 2021. Five of the Gold municipal awardees are from Bergen County (Leonia, Maywood, Fair Lawn, Garfield, and Rutherford). Down from the 28 Gold winners presently (2019-2021) – in 2019, we were awarded the Gold as well.

Our current Traffic Bureau consists of: Officer Anthony Bachmann, Traffic Coordinator, Officer Steven Villareale and Officer Bruce Reed.

The work we completed in achieving the Gold Award allows the Rutherford Green Team use of the Safe Routes To Schools GOLD award to get action points for Sustainable Jersey grants. *Provided by RPD Sgt. Julie A. Zeigler.* ###

## **Artful Thinking**

#### **Artful November 2021**

I will begin this Thanks-giving column by sending a heartfelt thank you to Lodi Library director Karyn Gost and staff for holding down the fort during the ravages of the pandemic. For me personally the Library is a valuable source of knowledge, discovery, and much joy as well as lasting friendships. Thank you Lodi Library.

The following paragraph was taken from an article published in the Lodi Bulletin in November of 1930 during the Great Depression.

"The wave of depression which has spread over the country perhaps leaves us with little to be thankful for this Thanksgiving. Be that as it may we should be grateful and thankful for that which we have for it could always be worse. When we sit down at the dinner table this year let us endure this economic depression and pray that we shall have much more to be thankful for come next Thanksgiving."

Well folks, next Thanksgiving is here and it caught me off guard. Do we have more to be thankful for? I guess that depends on who we ask.

We'll most likely receive mixed reviews on that question. I'll have to get back to you on that one. In 1930, our country had little reason for celebration. Families were being forced out into the streets while children were going without food and clothing. Mothers and fathers faced day after agonizing day of hardship. These were strong, able bodied men and women whose American dream was fast becoming a living nightmare. No work, no food, and no hope.

The Borough of Lodi followed the lead of surrounding towns by passing "emergency legislation" so as to create much needed work for the vast number of its unemployed.

The Borough accomplished this by the implementation of what Mayor Frank Gugliotti termed "Public Improvement Work."

In September of 1930, no less than 250 men whose families were facing starvation were immediately put to work. Their jobs included the installation of water mains and sewer lines throughout the community.

**Drive**Responsibly

The passing of the legislation, spearheaded by Councilman Michael "Packy" Cavallo, served Lodi a dual purpose. Under the supervision of the DPW the endeavor would not only be aiding the increasing number of the unemployed, it would also be fulfilling the need for additional water facilities. In 1930, not everyone had running water. The new water mains changed all of that.

During the winter of 1930, the Bergen County Board of Freeholders hired 800 men to widen streets, build highways, remove garbage and paint signs along country roads. Their salary was \$15 a week, seven hours per day, including transportation to and from work. A full course meal was also provided during the course of the day. Among those workers were men and women from the Borough of Lodi.

On a Tuesday night in early November of 1930, American Theater owner, Michael Basile, gave away as many as ten 18 pound turkeys during a showing of "Sweet Hearts and Wives" starring Bill Dove and Olive Brooks. The birds were given to those families in need who were in attendance.

In early December of 1930, the Mayor's relief committee was established. It was a good idea since it proved to be the difference for those struggling families who would have otherwise been facing a dark and desolate Christmas. The group consisted of Mayor Gugliotti, Councilman Cavallo, David Arnoldi, Police Chief Henry Witte, Joseph Pacella, John Butler, George Berardinelli and a warm hearted and generous community.

Their efforts made it possible for those less fortunate neighbors who were suffering the ill effects of economic doom to enjoy an abundance of food and clothing that would last through Christmas and beyond. On December 9th of that year, construction of Borough projects began. With it came employment for 400 Lodi workers whose lives were saved. So, too, was saved the American Spirit.

Happy Thanksgiving and God Bless America.


















## **Rutherford Blood Drive November 1 Honors Heroes**

#### **GERD** and the Holidays

The holidays are back, and many have been waiting to see family and friends that we have been social distanced from for the past two years.

As we prepare to resume enjoying the holidays with pleasurable indulgences, some may resume some of the gastroesophageal symptoms which accompany our favorite indulgences.

So, there are some considerations and precautions which may be help navigate the holiday season.

It's common to experience gastroesophageal reflux - otherwise known as acid indigestion, acid reflux or heartburn — every so often.

But heartburn also is a symptom of a chronic condition known as gastroesophageal reflux disease (GERD), which affects about 20 percent of the U.S. population, according to the National Digestive Diseases Information Clearinghouse.

#### What is acid reflux and GERD?

Acid reflux occurs when muscles of the lower esophagus relax and allow stomach acids to flow upward into the esophagus and even the mouth.

These stomach acids can cause irritation and inflammation of the esophagus. Acid reflux may progress further, developing into GERD. In patients who have GERD, the esophageal muscles are unable to keep stomach acids from flowing upward, causing corrosion of the esophageal lining and the uncomfortable

Consult with your dentist or physician if you are experiencing any of these symptoms more than twice a week, as this could be an indicator of a chronic condition.

#### How is GERD treated?

Although GERD is a chronic condition, its symptoms can be treated using medications and by making lifestyle modifications.

In addition to taking overthe-counter antacids and prescription H2 receptor blockers, you can reduce GERD symp-

#### **The Halloween Connection**

New Jersey is alleged to have a number of supernatural phenomena, ranging from the Jersey Devil of Smithville to Hookerman in Flanders.

However, the State is best known for two now famous locations. Camp Cristal Lake, of the movie "Friday the 13th," was filmed at Camp NO-BE-BO-SCO in Hardwick. The other location is the town of Grovers Mill, in the Township of West Windsor. You possibly have never heard of this place. However, on Halloween Eve of 1938, it drew the attention of over one million people.

In 1938, before television, the Internet, YouTube and the iPhone, the radio was the main form of home entertainment. A young radio personality, named Orson Welles, had a program, on CBS radio, called the "Mercury Theatre on the Air." This was a live program.

Mr. Welles wished to do an updated version of the sci-fi classic "War of the Worlds."

One of his writers was Howard Koch. It is alleged that Howard put a road map of New Jersey on the table and closed his eyes, then stabbed the map with a pencil. He hit Grovers Mill. This became the location of the onset of the Martian invasion.

The program began at 8 p.m. with supposed orchestra music from a ballroom of a

Many a small thing has been made large by the right kind of advertising. Mark Twain. plush New York hotel. The program was interrupted with a news bulletin from an observatory claiming activity on the planet Mars.

This was later followed up with a report of a landing of a strange object at Grovers Mill. On scene reports were describing the object disgorging another object with long legs. Additional news flashes described the annihilation of units of the New Jersey National Guard and the spreading of a black poisonous fog.

A number of people tuning in late to the program did not realize this was just a radio drama. Police switchboards began to become overloaded with frantic calls, some of which were reports of people seeing little green men. It was reported that there was a traffic jam in both directions on US Route 1. This was because people were fleeing in one direction and others were going to see the Martians!

Because this was broadcasted nationwide, people in New York, Philadelphia and Boston started to panic. Firearms were loaded by grim homeowners to protect family and property. The water tower in Grovers Mill was found to have been riddled with bullet holes, fired at it in the mistaken belief that it was a Martian attack device.

Mr. Welles swore to the press that it was only an innocent mistake. However, in later years, he hinted that this was his Halloween prank. ###

### **Housing Market – Returning to Normal?**

Earlier this year, buyers eager to flee NYC and other big cities were making full-price, contingency-free offers on homes without even bothering to see them. That seems to be much less the case in today's real estate marketplace and researchers say that the metro exodus trend appears to have largely spent itself out altogether.

Also less frequent are the bidding wars that were so commonplace only a few months ago. According to Zillow analysts, the typical buyer these days is making just two offers before one was accepted. And most buyers, 88% - again, according to the Zillow report - also added an inspection contingency to their contract. That makes us all breathe a little easier!

"Our 2021 survey of buyers found buying a home got more challenging in the past year, but many buyers were ultimately successful in landing a home without taking unnecessary risks," said Manny Garcia, a Zillow population scientist. "Most buyers continue to get inspections, and sellers appear to prioritize higher offers over waived inspections."

Sellers, though, are continuing to get higher prices. The S&P CoreLogic Case-Shiller Index shows that home prices rose a record 19.7% year-over-year in September, mainly because the supply of available homes has fallen to record lows.

Despite the continuing shortage of available homes, Zillow's spokesperson Garcia said most buyers are able to purchase a home by doing their research, making trade-offs, and "considering a diverse array of options."

The Zillow report also showed that repeat buyers are having an easier time navigating the current market than people buying their first homes, mainly because of record-high home prices. Repeat buyers have thousands of dollars in equity from the sale of their previous house to fund their down payment.

Unfortunately, first-time buyers often struggle to accumulate enough cash for a down payment. They also are - sadly less successful in submitting a winning bid. About two-thirds of first-time buyers submit more than one offer, say the experts, compared to 54% of repeat buyers.

Like the auto industry, real estate adapted quickly during the first months of the pandemic. Agents quickly emphasized online video tours of homes to overcome COVID-19 fears of both buyers and sellers. This year, most buyers personally visited a home before putting in an offer and were much more likely than in 2020 to attend an open house. In fact, this year's typical buyer visited three open houses, an increase from 2019.

But, as we in the industry constantly stress, it's important to remember that all real estate is local. Conditions in one housing market may not apply in another, even when they're only a few towns apart (Bergen County - a prime example). A great many buyers hear horror stories from friends and family about the "general" housing market which makes it vitally important for us to educate buyers about our local market. This is the only way that they can make the best decision for their family.

Buyers still strongly prefer in-person tours, but the technically advanced virtual ones have gained permanent popularity lately; they will continue to be an effective tool that is favored by both buyers and sellers. There's no doubt that watching a video tour of a home helps a buyer narrow down the list of potential houses to be visited in person. And that's a good thing in today's still pandemic wary environment...


