





## **Eighth Street Bridge Now Open**

Bridge linking Passaic to Wal- Fund ran out of money. The lington, officially opened in subsequent political stalemate August 2019.

The 290-foot bridge has two lanes on both sides and a left-hand turning lane onto Main Avenue in Wallington.

Before it closed, about 6,300 vehicles a day crossed the bridge.

The 103 year old Eighth Street Bridge had been on the drawing board for decades. In 2012 the federal government allocated the \$15 million for the project.

A series of eminent domain cases to take property on both sides of the bridge were resolved by 2015.

The rebuilt Eighth Street State Transportation Trust shut down bridge and road projects all over the State in the summer of 2016.

Work on the Eighth Street Bridge began in early 2017 and was estimated to take two years. The bridge was supposed to be finished earlier this year, but Passaic County received a seven-month extension on the project.

The Eighth Street Bridge connects the industrial lower Dundee section of Passaic with more residential Wallington. Passaic County is in charge

of maintaining the bridge, under a 1987 agreement with Bergen County that divides responsibility for the 12 spans along the Passaic River. ###





## Historically Speaking

#### Jacob D. Hasbrouck and the NJ & NY Railroad

From 1696 to the present day, Hasbrouck Heights has been known by a number of names. It was first called New Barbadoes Neck. By the time of the American War of Independence, it was known as Polifly. The United States Postal Service opened a post office here about 1870. It was named Corona. In the days before zip codes, this would lead to confusion with a village of the same name in Queens, NY. After only two decades of misdirected mail, the post office was renamed Hasbrouck Heights, in 1890.

Hasbrouck Heights was named in honor of Jacob D. Hasbrouck. Yet, Mr. Hasbrouck never lived in town. He was a resident of Westwood, NJ. He was, however, General Manager of the New Jersey & New York Railroad. He appears to be held in great esteem by the local residents by opening not one, but two stations in what would become Hasbrouck Heights.

The New Jersey & New York Railroad (NJ & NY RR) started life as the Hackensack & New York Railroad (H & NY RR). It was chartered by the State of New Jersey in 1856. By 1858, the line ran from Hackensack, south to Rutherford, where it interchanged with the Erie Railroad.

A new company started building north from Hackensack in 1866. It was the Hackensack & New York Extension Railroad (H & NY E RR) and by 1870 had reached Hillsdale. Later that year the railroad crossed the New York State border and reached Haverstraw,

It appears that the railroads experienced hard times and went into receivership in 1878. Both railroads were consolidated to form the Hackensack Railroad Company. In December 1886, it became the New Jersey & New York Railroad.

The 1888 addition of Poor's Manual of American Railroads lists the NJ & NY RR having 36.8 miles of track. This

includes 4 miles of the wholly owned Nanuet & New City RR and 1 mile of leased track from the Garnerville RR. The railroad owned 8 steam locomotives, 16 passenger cars, 5 baggage, mail and express cars, 30 box cars, 31 flat cars and gondolas, 1 stock car and 1 caboose.

That year, the NJ & NY RR carried 673,355 passengers and moved 102,065 tons of freight. Their net profit was \$71,607.09. Mr. Hasbrouck is listed as both general manager and a member of the board of directors.

The Erie Railroad entered into a 99-year lease agreement with the NJ & NY in 1896. The NJ & NY would exist as a subsidiary until the Erie merger with the Delaware, Lackawanna and Western RR, in 1960. As late as 1973, at least one caboose carried NJ & NY markings. This car was assigned to the Pascack Valley Line, as the NJ & NY route is now known.

Today, the Pascack Valley Line is owned and operated by New Jersey Transit Rail Operations. All tracks north of Spring Valley, NY, have been abandoned. NJ Transit runs 19 east bound and 21 west bound commuter trains each week day and 12 trains in both directions on weekends, serving 18 stations from Hoboken to Spring Valley.

There are now special trains to MetLife Stadium for sporting and other events held there. When the American Dream opens, NJ Transit expects to run regular service to that location. Freight operations are run by Conrail shared assets (CSX and NS) under an agreement with NJ Transit.

What of the two stations that served Hasbrouck Heights? The station named Hasbrouck Heights was located at the bottom of Franklin Avenue, across Route 17, just north of Malcolm Avenue, behind the Shell Gas station. It was closed in 1967. The other is located at the bottom of Williams Avenue. It was called Williams Avenue Station until the name was changed to Teterboro Station. ###



They also discovered that, no matter where we live, what shade of skin we have, or what language we speak, we are all part of the same race—the human race—and all part of the same family from Adam and Eve.







# Galactic Space Adventure





# Dental Injury Prevention

Most tooth injuries are a lifelong injury. Thus, a broken tooth is unable to mend itself and requires dental procedures to restore the mouth to the preinjury form and function.

safety protocols, using protective equipment, and good old common sense will create a more pleasurable and safe experience.

As the summer progresses, organized sports begin their training practices. Soccer, football, baseball (fall ball), softball, cheering, basketball. Of course, football is the ultimate contact sport. However, in my experience, there is one sport which has sent more patients to my office due to a dental injury. Many of The Gazette Newspaper readers may unfortunately remember those instances. That sport is baseball and softball. It is rarely thought of by the athletes, parents, and coaches to consider using protective mouth guards during play for these sports. It is seen more now than ever in professional baseball where the batters' helmets are equipped with faceguards. Well fitted mouth guards will provide excellent protection while being cost effective. There are some good store bought mouth guards available. However, not all mouth guards are appropriate for every person. For instance, those who wear orthodontic appliances, will require a special type of mouth guard. I advise anyone who is active either recreationally or in organized sports to consult with their dentist and determine what type of mouth guard is most appropriate for their activity. ###





## Real Estate Insight

## Trees. A Solid Investment.

I came back from vacation last month to find an altered landscape here in Hasbrouck Heights. For whatever reason, an oak tree near our office – probably 100 feet tall and perhaps nearly as old in years – had been cut down and carted off. It shaded the better part of a whole block on the Boulevard and its removal has produced, to my mind at least, another glaring hole in our environment.

People plant trees for a variety of reasons, primarily for their beauty and to provide shade but, certainly, they create many other benefits. Trees can sooth and relax us and help us connect with nature and our surroundings. The color green is a calming cool color that helps your eyes quickly recover from strain. By planting and caring for trees, you help enhance your surroundings, reduce pollution, lower energy costs, improve the appearance of your community and important to our discussion here increase the value of your property.

Most people, when they consider upgrading their homes to boost their property value, think mostly about the house itself. Most articles that focus on the return on investment of home improvements list kitchens and bathrooms first. Although improving these areas of your home can yield good returns on investments, these upgrades can also be quite costly and – owing to differences in taste & percep-

tion – the return might not be that great. However, adding landscaping and especially trees to your home can actually give you a better return on your investment, even more than anything interior.

The effect of trees on prop-

erty values is often overlooked, I think. What could be a simpler home improvement project than planting a tree? If you plan on keeping your property for a few years, think about planting a tree in the eight to ten foot range. The cost of good tree this size might be in the \$100 to \$150 range (less if you buy late in the season), depending on the species. If you are planting something more sought after, like Japanese maples, expect to pay more, but the value of these trees also increases more as they mature. In fact that's true of most well-chosen trees; plant a tree in your yard and its value will go up as it grows up!

But don't take my word on it. The Arbor Day Foundation cites some of the following effects of trees on property values...

Mature trees in a well-landscaped yard can add approximately 10 to 20 percent more value to a property. Commercial areas with trees also attract more customers (and they stay longer and spend more money), and apartments with trees have reduced tenant turnover.

A well-selected tree adds curb appeal and makes the home appear more established with its environment. According to Arbor Day, "83 percent of realtors believe that mature trees have a 'strong or moderate impact' on the salability of homes..." This perception increases to 98% on more expensive homes. [Think about it. What are some of the common characteristics of old, wealthy neighborhoods? Most of them have big, old trees!]

Depending on how your home is sited on your property, trees can provide shade during the heat of summer or protect your home from the winds in winter. This effect of trees can cut cooling and heating costs. According to the US Forest Service, "trees properly placed around buildings can reduce air conditioning needs by 30 percent and can save 20 to 50 percent in energy used for heating." If you're selling your home, this effect of trees on your home could be a real selling point when talking to potential homebuyers.

There are, of course, a multitude of other benefits. Here we're stressing only the return on investment angle of planting trees. A home improvement project this easy can't be beat. Dig a hole, plant your tree, keep it watered until established, and watch as the value of the tree in your yard grows alongside the value of your home!



## **Meadowlands Conservation Trust Receives \$1.5 Million Appropriation** From FY 2020 Budget

Hackensack Riverkeeper, Captain Bill Sheehan, announced The Meadowlands Conservation Trust (MCT) received a \$1.5 million appropriation in the New Jersey FY2020-Budget to be used toward the acquisition, enhancement and environmental stewardship of open space in the Hackensack River Watershed.

In 2017, the fund's entire \$3 million trust fund for environmentally valuable land purchases and other environmental uses was diverted by Governor Chris Christie's administration into the State Budget's general

The Trust was not notified of the action that left it with no monies to purchase and otherwise acquire environmentally valuable land. The remaining \$1.5 million is expected to be appropriated in next year's State Budget.

As this appropriation would not have been realized without Governor Phil Murphy and State Senator Paul Sarlo's steadfast advocacy for the MCT and, by extension, our green spaces and residents' quality of life in the Meadowlands and northern New Jersey.

Funding the Meadowlands Conservation Trust is a prime example of Governor Murphy and Senator Sarlo's firm dedication to working toward

greener and cleaner Meadowlands," said Vincent Prieto, President and CEO of the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority.


The Meadowlands Conservation Trust was established by an act of the New Jersey State Legislature in 1999 and empowered to obtain land through fee simple acquisitions and conservation easements for the purpose of permanently preserving wetlands, waterways, woodlands and other environmentally sensitive open space in the New Jersey portion of the Hackensack River Watershed.

Land or interests in land acquired by the Meadowlands Conservation Trust is preserved in perpetuity so that residents and visitors, both human and wildlife, may benefit from the many advantages that such dwindling open space provides. Trust properties include the 587-acre Kane Tract, the site of a major wetlands restoration project that traverses Carlstadt, Moonachie and South Hackensack. The Trust also owns Skeetkill Creek Marsh in Ridgefield, which is enjoyed by the public for passive recreation and viewing of nature.


